The first stage of St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School was opened on Sunday 20th January 2002 by His Beatitude Mar Meelis Zaia. Towards the end of his opening speech His Beatitude said "...a school, in which our people from all denominations will have pride in knowing that they have accomplished their national obligations upon which rely all the coming generations. May the blessings of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ be upon all of you."

Our school commenced its first term of teaching on Wednesday 30th January 2002, with 86 students.

Our school's motto is: Haimanoota, Yartoota and Yulpana which translates into: Faith, Heritage and Education.

Currently St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School is providing educational service to over 700 students including religious studies, Assyrian Language and all NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) Key Learning Areas.

His Beatitude's vision did not stop here. He also envisaged the development of a secondary education institution and it became a reality with the establishment of St Narsai Assyrian College and St Hurmizd Early Learning Centre.

Members of our Assyrian community in Australia are proud of these achievements and thankful that future generations of Assyrians living in Australia will have the opportunity to learn about their faith, history, language and culture.

Student Learning

Inspiring each child to achieve their personal best.

At St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School, our focus on the individual ensures that every student is educated to their full potential at every stage of their learning journey.

The K-6 curriculum integrates the six Key Learning Areas (KLA):

- English
- Mathematics
- Science and Technology
- Human Society and its Environment (HSIE - History and Geography)
- Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE)
- Creative Arts

The school model involves the core subjects of Literacy (English), Numeracy (Mathematics), Science and Technology, History and Geography (HSIE). These are differentiated and integrated to cater for the needs of each student by modifying the pace, level and content of teaching, learning and assessment activities.

Specialist teachers provide expertise in:

- Language - Assyrian
- Religious Education - Assyrian Church of the East

Assyrian Language

Language is one of the most significant gifts human beings possess. It not only serves as a means of communication in

our interaction with other people but it is also the vehicle through which we rationalise and express our emotions and feelings. Our capacity to verbalise a range of emotions, thought processes, abstract concepts, even our sense of humour is dependent on our acquisition of competent language skills so that we develop the ability to express ourselves and communicate with other individuals.

Children enjoy exploring different ways of expressing themselves through the vehicle of language. At St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School, students have the opportunity to learn Assyrian and appreciate it as one of the most beautiful and important languages in the world that gave voice to civilisation!

Assyrian is taught as a second or foreign language to all students at St Hurmizd Assyrian Primary School and is compulsory. Our program aims to inspire and motivate our young learners to develop language skills that are both relevant and useful. We provide the students with a diverse range of engaging activities to further their understanding of the Assyrian language. The fully qualified, specialist Assyrian teachers utilise a variety of educational technologies, as part of their daily lessons to bring the Assyrian language to life in our classrooms.

In infants, students receive two hours of Assyrian language instruction every week and this increases to three hours in the primary years. Classes in Years K-6 are grouped according to ability levels.

Student Leadership

In Year 6, students have the opportunity to take on more complex leadership roles. These include Sports Team and House Captains.

Registration

Entry points are Pre-Kindergarten (4 year olds) and Kindergarten. Casual vacancies, however, can occur in intervening year levels. Families are encouraged to discuss potential vacancies with the school at any year level. Enquiries can be directed to the school's front office.

Prospective parents are invited to register their interest by submitting an Application for Registration Form, which can be downloaded from the school website. Applications must address the criteria listed on the enrolment form, including payment of the appropriate non-refundable admission fee. All applications must be accompanied by a copy of your child's Birth and Baptism certificates and Immunisation History Statement.
